Yearbook News

We are excited about adding the dedication pages to this year's yearbook. Our goal is to have a 1/4 page personal dedication section for each student in kindergarten, 8th grade, and 12th grade. We are hoping that families will purchase those dedication pages and that others will consider donating the \$50 cost of the page for students whose families are not able to buy one.

We can accept dedication pages as late as **February 6, 2026**.

However, it takes us time to create the page and have it proofed. The entire yearbook has an early March deadline for us to have the initial yearbook printed by early May. It would be very helpful for pages to be ordered before Christmas. If you wish to purchase a yearbook (\$65) and a dedication page (\$50), you can purchase both for \$100 if you will make the purchases before

December 18, 2025.

Dedication pages can contain one or two pictures and text. Please submit your orders to Mr. Fanning (email: jamesfanning@hcstopeka.org, text: 620-273-9013). Digital photos can also be emailed to him or put on a flash drive and taken to the HCS office.

Please consider donating \$50 to purchase a dedication page for families that can not purchase one. You can purchase a dedication page anonymously, or we can let the family know who purchased the page in their name.

We are also selling ads this year. Parents who are interested in selling ads will earn PSCs for your time spent and will earn a free yearbook if they sell 10 ads. Ads must be submitted to Mr. Fanning by February 6, 2026. If you are interested in helping to sell ads, please contact Mr. Fanning by email or text as listed above. School Improvement Plan

Each year HCS administration reevaluates our School Improvement Plan to address current needs. The 2025-2026 School Improvement Plan has three goals based upon the overarching needs of our students and faculty:

1. By the end of the 2025-26 school year, 85% of students will demonstrate growth, or learning gain, and be on grade level or above as measured by the lowa Basics standardized tests core composite. 2. Enhance the rigor and relevance of curriculum to ensure that all students have access and entry points to high level content and skills. 3. By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, all HCS students will have received discipleship and opportunities to serve our community. Our teachers will also continue to work toward building the technological skills of our students.

Ms. Cunningham's 4th graders have been studying God's creation in Bible class and applying that knowledge in art, journaling, and language arts. During their art time, students have been working on a "Day I of Creation: God separated the light from the darkness" painting. They're incorporating pointillism techniques that they learned about in the first art lesson of the unit. Throughout the year, students will create other art pieces to correlate with the other days of Creation.

They start every school morning by reading a few verses from the book of John, journaling a short prayer, and sharing things they are thankful for. As school has been progressing, the students are embracing more of an attitude of thankfulness as they begin each day this way.

Students learned about the elements of haikus (three lines, syllabic pattern 5-7-5, talk about nature) and compared three different haikus. Then they brainstormed what they loved about nature and wrote their own haikus.
