### **TRM Food Drive**

For the next two weeks (December 3-15), HCS will be collecting food items for the Topeka Rescue Mission. There will be a box in the front lobby for your donations. The following list will help you with what items are needed. Food items that are always needed include canned proteins (tuna, chicken, sloppy joe, beans, chili, etc.), peanut butter, grape jelly, loaves of bread, dry pastas (all types), pasta sauce, rice (all types), canned soups (all types), canned fruits and vegetables, cereals, oatmeal, & Spaghetti O's. Clothing items needed include men's & women's underwear (new), men's jeans (sizes 30-40), men's shirts (3XL or larger), packages of socks, baby diapers (sizes 4 & 5), and pull-ups (sizes2T/3T & 4T/5T) Toiletry items are also needed: baby lotion and shampoo, full-sized bottles of conditioner, men's & women's deodorants, swabs, foot powder, ibuprofen, Tylenol, cough drops, Tums, razors and shaving cream, hair brushes, and hair bands. Each year HCS administration reevaluates our School Improvement Plan to address current needs. The 2025-2026 School Improvement Plan has three goals based upon the overarching needs of our students and faculty:

Enhance the rigor and relevance of curriculum to ensure that all students have access and entry points to high level content and skills. 3. By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, all HCS students will have received discipleship and opportunities to serve our community. Our teachers will also continue to work toward building the technological skills of our students.
