School Improvement

The 2023-2024 School Improvement Plan has three goals based upon the overarching needs of our students and faculty: 1) Ensure academic achievement in reading and writing by meeting or exceeding the end of year school-wide goal of each grade achieving 75% percentile or above in Language Arts, 2) Enhance the rigor and relevance of curriculum and outcomes to ensure that all students have access and entry points to high-level skills, and 3) Ensure students have the skills and support necessary to grow in their Christian walk and service as they carry out the school theme: Shine Like The Stars. Our teachers will also continue to work toward building the technological skills of our students.

The seniors served at Beautiful Feet Ministries in Fort Worth for their senior mission trip last week. They grew their faith as they led the worship services each day by leading songs, reading scripture and giving devotions, and doing skits and tricks that they related to the Christian walk. They also helped get people from the streets to Beautiful Feet on the bus routes, serve breakfast and lunch, distribute supplies and mail, and encourage the homeless. They helped with work projects for Beautiful Feet in the afternoons. They enjoyed a trip to Six Flags on Sunday afternoon and to Main Event for bowling and arcade games on Thursday evening.
