School Improvement Plan

Each year HCS administration reevaluates our School Improvement Plan to address current needs. The 2025-2026 School Improvement Plan has three goals based upon the overarching needs of our students and faculty:

1. By the end of the 2025-26 school year, 85% of students will demonstrate growth, or learning gain, and be on grade level or above as measured by the Iowa Basics standardized tests core composite. 2. Enhance the rigor and relevance of curriculum to ensure that all students have access and entry points to high level content and skills. 3. By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, all HCS students will have received discipleship and opportunities to serve our community. Our teachers will also continue to work toward building the technological skills of our students.

Our K3 & K4 classes learned many things in the first semester. They worked on letter formation, number order & recognition, being obedient, color recognition, and learning Bible stories. Miss Clubb and Mrs. Parker have used a variety of techniques in order to reinforce these important concepts. When they were learning about colors, they had a visual with pictures that were different colors; each student had to complete a sentence to explain their favorite picture and why. One said, "My favorite object is the red strawberry because strawberries are sweet." When working on letter formation for the letter "O", the students made "race tracks" on the floor and practiced staying on the track and going the correct direction so they didn't crash. When learning about obedience, Mrs. Parker used Ephesians 6:1 as a basis for why we obey. For number order and recognition, the students were timed on getting number cards for 0-9 in the correct order. To reinforce a Bible story, they went outside and reenacted the story of Elijah at Mt. Carmel using animal crackers for the sacrifice, pouring water (alcohol) on it, and setting it on fire.
