Friday: Comfy-Cozy Day (Relax in your favorite, school-appropriate, comfy clothes.)


You can begin planning costumes now and not have to think about them at the last minute!

School Improvement Plan

Each year HCS administration reevaluates our School Improvement Plan to address current needs. The 2025-2026 School Improvement Plan has three goals based upon the overarching needs of our students and faculty:

overarching needs of our students and faculty:

I. By the end of the 2025-26 school year, 85% of students will demonstrate growth, or learning gain, and be on grade level or above as measured by the lowa Basics standardized tests core composite. 2. Enhance the rigor and relevance of curriculum to ensure that all students have access and entry points to high level content and skills. 3. By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, all HCS students will have received discipleship and opportunities to serve our community. Our teachers will also continue to work toward building the technological skills of our students.

Mr. Fanning's 8/9 Bible students are analyzing a debate between two Al bots; one represents Believers and the other represents Atheists. The students will determine what each side says that is accurate and what each side says that is not accurate. One goal with this project is to determine the accuracy of an Al bot as it tries to explain Christianity. Since the Holy Spirit guides Christians into an understanding of scripture, and an Al bot therefore lacks true understanding, much of the focus will be on the bot that represents the Believer. Students are given a typed copy of a small portion of the debate; then they will listen to that portion. A group discussion of what they heard will follow. Students are encouraged to back up their statements with scripture. Some questions about what the Al bot representing the Atheist says may be assigned for students to do a deeper study and then report their conclusions to the class.
